

- You are responsible for reading, understanding, and abiding by all CLUB and Connecticut State Hunting Laws. No Sunday Hunting on Club or lease lands AT THIS TIME.
- You must purchase your button prior to October 1st;
 NO buttons will be sold after October 1st.
- Cost is \$25 for regular members and \$10 for a junior member.
- Because of the numbers of hunters, Pheasant Hunting is divided into three (3) groups, you must choose one either Wednesday, Saturday A or B. Saturday group rotates every week. Pheasant hunting starts at 8 am on Wednesday and Saturday stocking days.
- Wednesday group starts at 8 am, and must finish by 10 am, after that time all fields are open, on Saturday hunting starts at 8 am,

A or B group, and finishes at 10 am, then at 10:30 am the opposite group can hunt till 12:30 pm, after that all fields are open. Those other days follow the State Hunting Laws.

- Junior members can only hunt with either of their parents or sponsor, and they can't sign up for either stocking days or group.
- All hunters, hunting on Wednesday or Saturday must sign in and out, other days and after those hours on Wednesday/ Saturday, must sign in their birds in the LOG BOOK EITHER AT THE FIELD OR CLUB HOUSE.
- No Hunting is allowed in any Red Zone areas.

as you will need to purchase your 2019 badge prior to October 1st, from the bar. After that date, no badges will be issued, unless you are a new regular member. You also must fill out your permission slips, select the type of hunting activity you would like, as well as choosing your fall hunting group: (A, B, Wednesday). And finally, purchasing your badge.

Come September 30th, if you have not completed your work hour requirement, or paid your Raffle obligations, you will be notified. Failure to meet the required work hours, and any outstanding obligations, will result in the loss of your hunting privileges and your badge. A tremendous amount of work goes into this program from permission slips, organizing forms, verifying information on the permission slips, notifying members that information was incorrect or left out, cross checking work hours, obligations paid for, and finally issuing badges. This is to ensure that everyone is eligible to hunt, after meeting these requirements.

In May, June and July the Grounds Guys were very busy tilling and planting food and cover crops for improving our hunting areas. We have planted silage corn and a hybrid forage called sudax. It is a cross between sorghum and Sudan grass. I have good luck growing this at the other club I belong to by planting several acres in patch like plots. The other major crop is field corn and it is maturing nicely and will provide through mid-March.

All this is a work in progress and will take a few seasons to fully develop our plan for habitat improvement and will look to work with USDA soil conservation service for advice and assistance with developing our plan.

For this hunting season we will have mowed walking paths in our shooting fields, and we are going to reopen the trail from the skeet field to the power line as it has grown in quite a bit.

This year we have used the tractor to assist Archery, Sporting Clays, Pheasants, Ponds and Shotgun sports to do various tasks that needed to be done.

In closing I would ask for volunteers to help with the reposting of the club property for preserve signs and dog training areas, red zone and private property signage. It is a good way for members to learn where the club boundaries are located.
