TREASURER'S REPORT

Well, with this newsletter I want to show you in a different way how big the membership contribution to the Fin's revenue is. By far and away dues and assessments bring in the most money for implementing our various activities and programs. In the Figure below, I have plotted the percentage of the monthly income due to membership activities. The months of December and January generate more than 50% of their income from dues. Together with the additional months of February, March, and November, they constitute 5 months in which membership fees contribute 10 % of the income. As John Postemski stated at our March Membership Meeting, we cannot afford to let our membership numbers fall without seriously impacting the things we like to do. John and others also noted the importance of bringing your friends to the Fin; the place will sell itself. All of the existing members should remember that we are ambassadors for the Club and as such we need to act friendly and welcoming to all visitors as they are prospective members.

The Fin will host three (3) registered skeet shoots in 2012, the NEOPEN to be held on June 1, 2 & 3; followed by the Zone 1 Shoot, August 10, 11 & 12; and culminating on Labor Day weekend, September 1 & 2, with the Connecticut State Skeet Shoot. All three events promise to be big shoots with upwards of 50 shooters attending. The club needs to be in tip-top shape as many of the shooters will be visiting the Fin for the first time. In particular, the skeet fields need to be in perfect order and for this we shall need a number of workers spread over the entire period. The work to be done is not specialized, i.e., you don't need to be a skeet shooter to come and help (and earn your work hours). 2012 FIN FUR & FEATHER PRACTICAL PISTOL MATCHES

Practical matches are a lot of fun and will be held at the dates/times indicated below. Matches are held in the Sand Pit which is accessed by driving past the skeet fields and 5-stand field. Be aware that if 5-stand is open, the road is closed. Pass the area 30mins before 5-stand begins (times/dates will vary)! All matches require a belt-mounted hip holster and extra magazines (2 minimum). Matches are approximately 50rds-center fire (unless specified otherwise). Eye and ear protection are mandatory for all; spectators are welcome. Recommended equipment includes magazine carrier, chair, knee pads, hat.

SPORTING CLAYS

Well looks like our spring might be arriving early, and with that another season of Sporting Clays is upon us. We have our dates selected as does East Glastonbury and Andover. Our dates for the 50-target shoots will be May 6th, June 3rd, June 24th (CWA event, 100 targets), July 15th, Aug 5th and finally Sept 9th. All events start @ 9am and go until 1pm. As in the past those working will be provided with a breakfast or lunch sandwich. These events also provide members with easy work hours; be at the club by 8am on the day of the shoot and be prepared to participate until 1:30. Please set aside one of these dates or more to operate the traps (we provide instruction). Please call me at 860-933-4768 to let me know which dates you can work; we will remind members via the website, and by e-mail. We plan to have a short work day on Saturday April 14th , weather permitting, from 9am until finished. We need to set up safety

fences, gun racks, hull buckets, clear the shooting ports of leaves and small brush, and set up the manual traps with covers. The more people we have, the quicker the task will be completed. The Club has provided us with additional funds to purchase two additional electric traps this year, so we can offer many different target presentations at each shoot. The East Glastonbury dates are May 20th, June 10th, Sept 30th, and Oct 28th. Andover shoots are scheduled for March 25th, April 29th, Sept 16th and Oct 14th. These Clubs start their shoots at 9am as well.

So look at your calendar and mark a date or dates to come out to trap/work these shoots. The CWA shoot on June 24th will require a minimum of 28 members to host this event; we usually need members to arrive by 8am and the shoot ends about 12:30, then lunch, and departure by 2pm. Until then, "Be safe, and "Keep breaking those targets".

Welcome to a new year of Field and 3-D Archery! Please note the schedule below.

The target Pick-up is the days of the shoots from 12:30 pm to 1:30 pm.

We have purchased new targets for this year and added two medium deer, one large deer and a medium brown bear to our collection. We also purchased five stands which should assist in target set up. If they prove beneficial, I will be asking the executive board for more of these to speed up the set-up process for large and medium targets.

On Sunday March 4th, the archery committee erected the signs to the range and modified the target locations. This new set up will allow the skeet fields and five-stand to be open during 3-D shoots. We are now using the upper field near the sand pit. The executive board gave the archery committee permission to set up a new range as well. This new range will be in the area of the power lines and the fly pond and will be behind the pistol and rifle ranges. When this new range is in use, the pistol and rifle ranges will not be able to be used during the target set-up, the shoot and take-down. With the area provided, we will be able to set up 30 to 40 additional targets, and this will free up the sporting clay area as well. This design will allow operation of all shooting sports and make money for the club. I will be talking to the archery committee over the next couple of months to start planning this project. I hope to see you all again, and for those who missed last year's shoots I hope that you will participate.
