RAFFLE

The Executive Board each year has looked at either increasing dues or making an obligation that each member must purchase or sell their Club Raffle tickets. The Executive Board felt that the raffle was a better solution. The raffle income has help keep our dues to where it is today. The Club requires each member who is eligible to either sell or purchase a minimum \$40 of the \$60 worth of tickets that are sent to you. Needless to say there are great prizes. Some members may be offended about selling or purchasing their tickets, which is understood. However you are still obligated to purchase/sell the required number of tickets. Inside your raffle package you will find tickets and a slip for when you turn your tickets, please be sure you keep your receipt. All tickets must be turned in on the night of the drawing.

HUNTING BADGES

Please mark your calendars as you will need to purchase your 2017 badge prior to October 1st. After that date, no badges will be issued, unless you are a new regular member. You must fill out your permission slips, selecting the type of hunting activity you would like and which fall hunting group you want to join, before



purchasing your badge. Come September 30th, if you have not completed your work hour requirement, or paid your obligations, you will be notified. You must pay for those work hours, and any outstanding obligations, or you will lose your hunting privileges and your badge. Tremendous amount of work goes into this program from producing permission slips, organizing forms, verifying information on the permission slips, notifying members that information was incorrect or left out, cross checking work hours, confirming that obligations have been paid up, and finally issuing badges. This is to ensure that everyone is eligible to hunt, after meeting those requirements.

It is your responsibility to make sure that information, work hours, obligations, and payments have been completed in order to purchase your badge. Please keep your receipts. It is not up to the Hunting Chairman or Club, it is you.

MEMBERSHIP

FISH COMMITTEE REPORT

All fishermen must purchase a badge for \$25.00, which entitles them to fish and hunt or, new this year, you can purchase a Fish Only button for \$15.00. All Junior members must also purchase a badge for \$10.00. The badges are available for purchase at the bar.

Fish stockings will take place on the following dates:

- 1st stocking March 30th {Weather Permitting}
- 2nd stocking April 12th
- 3rd stocking May 4th

The stocking will start around 4:30pm each day and we would appreciate any volunteers who can make it. Buttonball Trout Hatchery located near the club will supply the fish. The fish will be in good shape since they only have a short trip from the hatchery to our ponds. Brook and rainbow trout will make up over 90% of the fish stocked, with 12-14" fish the minimum size with a good number of 16"+ fish added as well. Brown trout will make up the remaining percent of fish stocked at the last stocking as they are more temperature resistant. FYI – The upper pond will be CLOSED from May 4th until May 7th, the day of the Kid's Fishing Derby.

The Kid's fishing derby will be held Sunday, May 7th from 9am – 12 noon at the fly pond. Sign-up sheets for kids who will be attending will be located on the message board in the bar. The maximum age limit for participants is 15 years of age. Members who don't have children within this age limit can bring a relative (niece, nephew, grandchild) instead. Lunch will be provided free to the children and the kitchen will be open for adults to purchase food and drinks.

We are seeking donations so we can purchase additional fish and prizes for the derby. There will be a sign up sheet located in the bar. Please donate and help make this event fun for all participants!



- * Sunday Bow Hunting is for lease land "only".

IMPORTANT NOTE

When purchasing your badge and you plan on hunting pheasant in the fall, please be certain of which group you plan on hunting with. Once these buttons are purchased, you will not be able to exchange them to another hunting group.

The groups are Wednesday, Saturday "A", and Saturday "B".
