MEMBERSHIP

PRICE INCREASES

Members,

As you may are all aware, there are some price changes here at the Club. The first is the cost of targets; they have gone up almost \$2.00 a case since our last delivery back in March. Along with this increase, the power grid provider has a delivery fee which doubled or tripled the cost of usage fee. The cost of a round was discussed at the last Board meeting, as well as the cost of electricity. A decision was made to increase the cost of a round of Skeet, Trap, and Modern skeet member rounds to \$4.00/round, and all guest fees to \$5.00/round.

Please remember to pay for your rounds before leaving the Club grounds, either through the Bar, hours are Tuesday 1-5, Friday 12-8, Saturday and Sunday 9 through 5, or use the drop box in the door next to the bar entrance.

Another cost is items purchased over the Bar. During the past year and a half, all consumer products throughout the nation have increased sharply. We have seen this in our food, gasoline, etc. Here at the Club we are feeling this same increase for products consumed over the Bar. Upon recent discussions at the last Board meeting, a decision was made that effective Sept. 1st, that all products sold over the bar will need to be increase by \$.50 cents.

BUILDING & GROUNDS

Members, there is still a lot of wood that members-only can take. There are logs out at the power lines and at the tree line in front of the skeet/trap fields. As a reminder, skeet/trap fields are open at 9 am, you'll need to get there early to cart off the wood. The logs by the wood barn and telephone are the Club's to support our usage, please do not take these. SKEET REPORT

The Eastern Connecticut Skeet Club Winter League is due to start October 2nd and run through April 23rd. The Fin is well represented with 2 teams in Division 1, 3 teams in Division 2, 2 teams in Division 4, and 1 team in Division 6. Good luck to all our Fin Teams.

A reminder to all members that skeet/trap rounds are now \$4.00 for 25 targets, non-member fee is \$5.00 per 25 targets. This increase is due to a very substantial increase in clay targets costs. Recent delivery cost \$21,229 for 23 pallets. If you shoot more than 25 clays, you'll need to pay an additional round fee. Our inventory/income control has been up and down this past year, so please pay for your rounds and additional cost if you shoot more than 25.

The Fin is running the 2nd Annual Larry Shewokis Memorial 50 bird non-registered shoot on September 25th. This shoot is open to anyone with a known average. So please come out and participate in this friendly and worthy shoot. There will be complimentary burgers and dogs for the shooters.

Always remember proper gun safety, shooting etiquette, and always wear eye and ear protection whether or standing around watching.

The Skeet Committee would like to thank all the members who have participated in the work days, different work functions, and support for the skeet program. Special thanks to Gary Charron and Dick Palmer for keeping the skeet/trap/5-stand fields mowed and looking great.

Maps can be found on FB under files, at the bar or I can email you a digital copy if needed. I encourage members new and old to please review the clubs hunting rules as well as the state hunting rules and regulations for any new changes.

Sept 28, 29 and October 2nd once again we will be holding a hunter safety program for firearms. It is currently listed on the state Website and registration opened August 30th. We have a limited number of spots reserved for club members. If you are a member who needs the class please contact me and I will give you a specific registration code.
