Please do not change the height of the targets.

When done shooting, please put the equipment into the low house on each field, this way all the equipment will not end up in one house. If there are any issues with any of the equipment, please put a note on it and leave in field 5, low house. **DO NOT leave the machines empty, please fill after use.**

The Trap Summer League is going well. There are 20 people that are shooting. Scores are improving as the Summer goes on! Congrats to Al Letendre on shooting his first 25 straight! Now he has a hat with a lot of holes in it!
