

FISH COMMITTEE REPORT

All fishermen and women must purchase a badge for \$50.00 which entitles them to fish and hunt.. All Junior members must also purchase a badge for \$10.00. The badges are available for purchase at the bar.

Fish stockings will take place on the following dates:

- 1st stocking March 14 th (Weather Permitting)
- 2nd stocking April 11th
- 3rd stocking May 2nd

The stocking will start around 4:30pm each day and we would appreciate any volunteers who can make it. Buttonball Trout Hatchery located near the club will supply the fish. The fish will be In good shape since they only have a short trip from the hatchery to our ponds. Brook and rainbow trout will make up over 90% of the fish stocked, with 12-14" fish the minimum size with a good number of 16"+ fish added as well. Brown trout will make up the remaining percent of fish stocked at the last stocking as they are more temperature resistant.

FYI - The upper pond will be CLOSED from may 2nd until May 5th, the day of the Kid's Fishing Derby. The Fly Pond will be closed IMMEDIATELY following the Kids Fishing Derby and will reopen after John Shea's Biggest Trout Derby on May 11th.

The Kids fishing derby will be held Sunday, May 5th from 9am - 12 noon at the fly pond. Signup sheets for kids who will be attending will be located on the message board in the bar. The maximum age limit for participants is 15 years of age. Members who don't have children within this age limit can bring a relative (niece, nephew, grandchild) instead. Lunch will be provided free to the children and the kitchen will be open for adults to purchase food and drinks.

We are seeking donations so we can purchase additional fish and prizes for the derby. There will be a sign up sheet located in the bar. Please donate and help make this event fun for all participants! All ponds open for fishing (catch and release) on March 16thth at 8am

Middle and skeet pond open for fishing (catch and keep) with 2 fish limit on April 13th at 6am. Upper pond opens for fishing (catch and keep) on May 11th after John Shea's biggest trout derby.

SPORTING CLAYS

Sporting Clays season is right around the corner, and I want to encourage everyone to come and shoot the course. Sporting clays is a shotgun game where you walk through the woods and shoot at clay targets that are presented in various hunting scenarios. No experience is necessary and good fun is had by all.

The sporting clay program is labor intensive. I need trappers to sit on the machines and throw the targets when the shooters yell pull, it's that easy, simply push a button or pull a lever to release the target. Once again there is no experience necessary, I teach every trapper what to do the morning of the shoot before it gets started. Trappers show up at 8 AM and the shoot is usually done by 2 PM at which time I buy lunch for all of the trappers. I need 15 trappers for each date. I strongly encourage you to check your calendars and sign up to work early. Plan your shooting and plan your work hours!

As you know 10 work hours are mandatory and are billed at \$20 per hour, save yourself the \$200, work the hours and spend the money on shells. I give 6 hours per shoot. You must email me to get on the list of trappers as I need to coordinate the help in advance the more notice the better.

I am looking forward to working and breaking some clays with all of you. Thanks.
