NEW SHINGLES FOR THE PAVILION AND CLUB HOUSE ROOFS/CHIMNEYS

Members. The Executive Board has been receiving quotes for new shingles on both the Clubhouse and Pavilion roofs, the shingles are at the end of their life expectancy. The pavilion already has a hole through the roof, which needs immediate attention, so not to have the elements damage any additional sheathing. This roof is original from day one.

We are also looking to place a cap/cover on our chimney in the bar, need to install a new chimney for the furnace. The hall fireplace chimney we want to remove the chimney to the roof line, block the flu and then sheath the opening. This will then make the fireplace non-functional. We also have that huge maple at the corner of the pavilion, that needs trimming so not to cause any damage down the pike.

We were also able to purchase a new Laporte trap for the field that has come in, and will be introduced to the course in the 2025 season. Each field should have 5 speakers, voice box and an on/off switch. If anything is not working, please leave in low house 5 with a note on it. The 4 lower fields (5-8) are for Regular Trap, field 4 is for Doubles, field 3 is for Skap.

Please fill up the machines when done shooting, it is very frustrating When the machines are left empty for the next person. In colder weather, the machines need to be warmed up a little more before shooting.

With the Winter Skeet League approaching, there will be a lot of activity, please work together so everyone can shoot.

I would like to remind everyone that it is important to purchase your hunting badges before September 30th and please complete your work hours or pay for them prior to the deadline. You will be able to purchase your badge after September 30th however the badge price increases to \$100

Sept 15	Opening Day of Archer Season (private land)
Sept 16	Opening Day Archery (state Land)
Sept 28	Pheasant Fun Trial 9am-1pm
Sept 29	Firearms Hunter Education (seats available)
Oct 12	Pheasant Fun Trial 9am-1pm
Oct 19	Opening Day of Pheasant Season

Please remember to park in only designated areas on club and leased property. Please refrain from driving in any of the fields. It is important that we respect the property, so we keep it for years to come.

ATVs are not to be used on any club or leased property without the board of directors permission. Parking passes should be displayed at all times. Last, I would like to thank each and every club member who has worked hard this year to make sure we will have a successful hunting season. So many hours behind the scenes to make sure the grounds are brushed hogged and roads and parking areas are cleared. It truly does take a committed team.
