The membership categories are as follows:



Above all, maintain **ALL** safety protocols regarding firearm handling and safe muzzle control. Please respect your fellow club members, guests, family members, and other shooters.

Thank you to Andy Dowd and Shawn Peach, and others for running these events.




### CHILI COOKOFF
