### SPORTING CLAYS

The sporting clay season is in full swing. 46 members have participated in the success of the program so far this year contributing 135 hours collectively. Sporting clays runs on member work hours. The first shoot was a great success with record participation. After target expenses the club profited \$2,469. This was a group effort. Thanks to the workers and the trappers.

#### For the Shooters:

The price of the shoot is \$20 for 50 targets and is open to both members and non members, so bring your friends and show off your club. There is no need for advanced registration you sign up on the day of the shoots all of which start at 9 AM. Expect a wide variety of targets designed to simulate hunting, rabbits, squirrels, and birds of all kinds.

#### For the Workers:

I need about fifteen members to run each shoot. We start at 8 AM and finish up early in the afternoon, usually around 1 PM at which point I buy you lunch. Work hours are required for all members and sporting clays is probably the easiest and most fun way to get your hours in. No experience is required and for the most part all you have to do is push a button and or pull a lever, plus you get to watch all of the shooters. Virtually all of the people that work sporting clays eventually become shooters themselves.
