Each field should have 6 speakers, voice box and an on/off switch. If anything is not working, please leave in low house 5 with a note on it.

The 4 lower fields (5-8) are for Regular Trap, field 4 is for Doubles, field 3 is for Skap.

Please fill up the machines when done shooting, it is very frustrating when the machines are left empty for the next person.

In colder weather, the machines need to be warmed up a little more before shooting.

With the Winter Skeet League approaching, there will be a lot of activity, please work together so everyone can shoot.

SHOTGUN SPORTS

The Skeet Committee would liker to thank all the Fin members that performed maintenance, worked events and participated in the work details for the Skeet program this year. Thanks to your loyal support our skeet program was a success. We would also like to thank our bartenders for maintaining and processing all the skeet payments and receipts.

The Eastern CT Skeet Club Winter league is due to start on October 5th and run into April 2026. The Fin currently has 9 teams entered, good luck to them all. The Skeet fields will be busy Saturday and Sundays for practice and match shooting, please be aware. The skeet league schedule is posted on the bulletin board in the bar, and it's on the ECSC website.

The Skeet inventory/payment/loss control was doing fine for most of the year, but in July and August the Club has lost a very significant amount from members not paying for their rounds (25 targets), and additional targets thrown. Every target thrown costs the Club \$.15 each. Please pay either through the drop box located on the bar supply entrance door, or inside when the bar is open. The Club has lost over \$600 dollars during these two (2) months. The Club can't continue in this direction without extreme restrictions considered.

It was also very nice to see some new shooters to the game this year, there seemed to be many more than last year. There is always someone willing to guide a new shooter through the process and help out. Repairs were made to our shooting boxes, the newest trap was implemented at the past 2 shoots giving shooters another clay to figure out. No 25's were recorded this year, but there were still a lot of good numbers put up with a few 24's and many 23's out there. Thank you to the members that stepped up to help at the shoots and help with repairs and field maintenance. There are no more shoots planned for this season, we will be opening back up in the spring next year.
